Rosters

Heather Connor has prepared the latest rosters, emailed and available in print form at centres. She says:

You may notice a change in the numbers of people rostered on as sidespeople at St John's. We are in great need of more help in this area, because it is a legal requirement that two people sign off on the money counting. This provides protection for those concerned if there are ever any queries (none in my memory!). From Watsonia the money comes to Heidelberg for counting, so this rule does not apply there.

I have been concerned that with fewer and fewer people committing to this task, the burden on those willing to do it has become more than I think should be asked. It has meant that over the past 6 months, some people are doing the job too frequently for it to be sustainable. In order to lighten this burden, I have discussed with Denise the following plan.

For combined services there will always be two people rostered on to do sidesperson duty as we have had in the past.

For other services there will be one person rostered on (who gets to church early to be at the door). However, during the notices, clergy will ask for a volunteer from the congregation, to help this person for about 10–15 minutes after church, and to sign that the money counting has been correct. If this works, the commitment becomes very light, and I did find that it eased my job on the roster considerably.

Watsonia car park sale

• No official letter yet to confirm informal report from Bishop Kate, that Abp-in-Council agreed proceeds of Watsonia car park sale would be split 60/40 between parish and diocese.

- Granted \$30,000 by the Melbourne Anglican Foundation to assist revitalisation plans for Watsonia. Money already received, waiting on details on spending & reporting requirements.
- As first step. McCrindle Research to prepare demographic survey of Watsonia and environs.

Dance Artistry Australia (was Tiny Dancers)

 DAA are seeking assured access to the halls at St John's for preferably five-year periods. They want a number of modifications at their expense: we have already approved several. Concern over their wish to install a sprung floor in the lower hall: DAA wants ASAP. whereas David Wagner, architect planning renovations, prefers this be delayed. Ask David reasons for recommending delay.

Finance report

 Emmi absent, so no formal Treasurer's Report, but accounts show November surplus \$11,095, year-to-date surplus \$85,051-a consequence of several one-off inflows.

St Andrew's

- Quote for the installation of heating + cooling in halls and offices. Getting two more quotes.
- Cars speeding past the entrance to St John's: letter to be sent to Banyule City Council requesting both a speed hump and a 'Concealed Entrance' sign.


